
REGION 2 MONTHLY MEMO October 2000

Mir Space Station to Come Down Soon

The 14-year-old Mir space station, once a symbol of Soviet space glory, will come down in February in a controlled descent that will send it hurtling into a remote area of the Pacific Ocean. The decision came after months of wrestling over what to do with the Mir, which Russia's Cabinet can no longer afford to maintain. The Mir is by far history's longest-serving space station. It went up on February 20,1986 and that makes it over 14 years in space to date. Russia approved a plan to crash Mir into the Pacific 900 to 1,200 miles east of Australia on Feb. 28-29. Russian wants to concentrate its funds on the new international space station instead of Mir. NASA has been urging the Russians to do this for years. For those



who pay close attention to space history, this will be a sad day in space history. It can also be thought of though as a new era for Russians they will now be more in tune to the worlds space history not just there own or America's.

APPLICANTS SOUGHT FOR JOB OF SFHQ VICE CHIEF OF COMPUTER OPERATIONS by Mark Anbinder, Comp Ops Chief-elect

As you all know, Teri Smith will be stepping down from the role of STARFLEET CompOps Vice Chief for Membership Processing at the end of this year. Now that the election is over and we know the Rickard/Goldberg administration will be taking the helm on January 1st, it's time to seek Teri's successor for the 2001-2002 term of the Rickard/Goldberg administration.

STARFLEET's Membership Processing department handles all of the membership applications and renewals, inquiries, and modifications for STARFLEET's thousands of members. The Membership Processing Coordinator is responsible for receiving all new member and renewal applications, processing credit card transactions, and working with STARFLEET's member database, as well as interacting with members to make any needed changes.

Applicants must have regular, reliable Internet e-mail access and web access, access to a Windows-compatible computer with Microsoft Access 97, and access to a computer with Microsoft Word 97, 98, 2000, or 2001, and Microsoft Excel 97, 98, 2000, or 2001. (I use Virtual PC on a Mac to run Access 97 under Windows 98 effectively; you needn't have an actual Intel computer.)

Applicants must have ready access to a local USPS facility with post office boxes available for rent, where STARFLEET's Membership Processing PO Box may be conveniently checked at least twice per week.

STARFLEET's Membership Processing Coordinator must retrieve paper applications from the membership PO Box and online applications from an e-mail mailbox regularly, prepare checks and money orders for deposit and process credit card transactions, process applications by adding new members or updating renewing members in the database, and send out member packets in a timely manner. All of the financial transactions are logged, and all of the applications are filed for ready reference purposes.

This department is also responsible for such database updates as changes of address, new chapter assignments, and other modifications to members' records. Meanwhile, the Membership Processing Coordinator must also maintain a supply of member packets and their components, and track reimbursable expenses for production of such materials.

The Membership Processing Coordinator must be able to respond in a timely manner to all member inquiries and to inquiries and requests from fellow Computer Operations staff members.

Recognizing Emergencies Check, Call, Care If not breathing If not breathing and no pulse If burned If suddenly ill Emergency Action Steps
If unable to speak, cough, or breath
If air won't go in
If bleeding
If unable to move or use a body part
